## Rabbi Jesse Charyn

Na'eem me'od (nice to meet you) I'm Rabbi Jesse. I started here at Bet Shira on July 1st. I'm filled with *kavod* and *ruach* to be your rabbi. I was born and raised in Chattanooga, TN. After high school graduation I attended Hadassah's Young Judaea Year Course, a gap year program that offered university credits and an opportunity to volunteer and get to experience life in Israel. I had a phenomenal gap year experience which resulted in my making Aliyah and serving in Golani Special Forces in the IDF. While I was a soldier I met our Rebbetzin as she was attending Year Course. After a few months of dating, Shira convinced me to leave Israel where I had been living in the Negev desert and trade it for the Sonoran desert. I joined Shira at Arizona State University where we both completed our undergraduate studies. I then began my rabbinical studies, initially at Ziegler (where I had incredible professors and made life-long friends) then at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College (where I again formed strong bonds with peers and mentors). I then spent some time immersed in the *frum* world studying in a Yeshivah in the Old City of Jerusalem and transferring to the former Rosh Yeshiva's new community in Phoenix, AZ (of all places!). I then pursued chaplaincy at a Trauma I medical center in Phoenix and after completing chaplaincy residency was offered a chaplain role in a Continuous Care Retirement Community in AZ. From there an opportunity presented itself to lead a Reform congregation in the metro Atlanta, GA area. Most recently I returned to senior care as the rabbi/Director of Spiritual Care at Miami Jewish Health. Within one week of our move to Miami we found Bet Shira Congregation. My route to the rabbinate was authentic and unconventional, qualities that you will find accurately sum me up. As a rabbi I am constantly aware that I represent my community. I could not be a rabbi without my rebbetzin. Shira and I have been together since she was 18 and I was 21. I'll be turning 39 in September. Judaism is a family endeavor and I am blessed to have Shira, Rayna, Navah, and Zivah involved in my rabbinate. For those of you not familiar with the role of a rebbetzin, it is not a formal role. It is essentially an extension of a rabbi (and in case you were wondering, a rebbetzin is the spouse of a rabbi). Shira is one of my dearest *chevrusas* (study partners). As a rabbi I am a religious and spiritual leader. Pastoral care is central to my rabbinic practice. My cell phone number is on my cards. If you need me I'm here for you. We are a family. I hold office hours, but I try to be out of my office as much as possible getting to know our Bet Shira family and our wider community in my service as an ambassador of Bet Shira. It is an honor and a calling to be a rabbi. I am privileged to be yours.
