## Rabbi Jesse Charyn

*Chodesh tov*! September/Elul is a very special time of year for all of us, but an especially meaningful month for me. There is an atmosphere of excitement and anticipation that Elul brings as we approach Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and not only due to the sounding of the shofar each morning. In addition to the hopes and opportunities of a new year, this time of year is special to me as I was born and married in September/Elul. As it turns out my bashert, the Rebbetzin, and I share the same Hebrew birthday on the 23rd of Elul! The acronym for Elul, according to our Talmud, is *Ani I'dodi v'dodi li*, I am my beloved and my beloved is mine.

For me it is easy to think of my relationship with Hashem at this time, because Hashem is intrinsically tied to my relationship with my wife. When I think about all the blessings in my life, my family is the first that comes to mind. Marriage is not easy and requires a commitment reinforced daily. The demands of raising a young family and the privilege and responsibility of being a rabbi can make it is easy to put off a lot of the deep introspection of our marriage until we celebrate the anniversary of our time under the *chuppah*.

In our Jewish tradition we speak about God being present in marriage. In practice this is understood and experienced differently for each couple. For Shira and I, God's role in our marriage is reinforced each morning when we wake up, even before we had our girls, and begin our day with *Modeh Ani*. Life gets stressful and even though we've been together for almost 18 years, sometimes we let our emotions cloud our understanding that what we do is always aligned with our shared beliefs and priorities. This is where God comes in. Hashem adds holiness to our union. Sometimes Shira has to remind me that it is not just the two of us, that it is our strong relationship with Hashem that helps us to bring our best selves to our relationship.

Each year on September 6th Shira and I take time to discuss how we've grown and how our understanding of our marriage has deepened and changed in the previous year. We check in with one another and discuss what we need to feel fulfilled, valued, and validated in our marriage.

Similarly as we arrive in the month of Elul we begin to consider more thoughtfully our connection to God. We think about what we need from God. How our understanding of God has changed over time. We think about our relationship to Judaism. We think about the New Year and all of the promise it holds. We also think about relationships in general. This is our time to reflect about what kind of partner we have been to God. This is also a time to think about how we have treated one another and to act based on our introspection to acknowledge when we have fallen short of what we know we are capable of. We also think about loved ones that have died and the ways they have influenced the people we are and how we honor them as we continue living.

Just as a marriage is not just the day of the wedding, the same is true for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. If we show up for services without any preparation, we miss out on so much. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are not spectator holidays. Time, energy, tears of joy and frustration, all of these are present in our relationships. In our Jewish tradition Elul is considered a time of preparation for our judgment. Our sages remind us that just one act can tip the scales in our favor.




